I expect that once the current physical distancing restrictions lift and we are able to resume something resembling our former way of doing business, I will continue to use many of the new strategies I have learned throughout this period. It's all a matter of my commitment to offer the best music education I possibly can to each and every one of my students.

Sadly, it appears that we will be wrapping this year up still in quarantine which means our end of year recital will need to be very different from year's past. I am working on plans for my first ever virtual recital! Our tentative date is Sunday, June 7. I will send more details as it comes together.
